

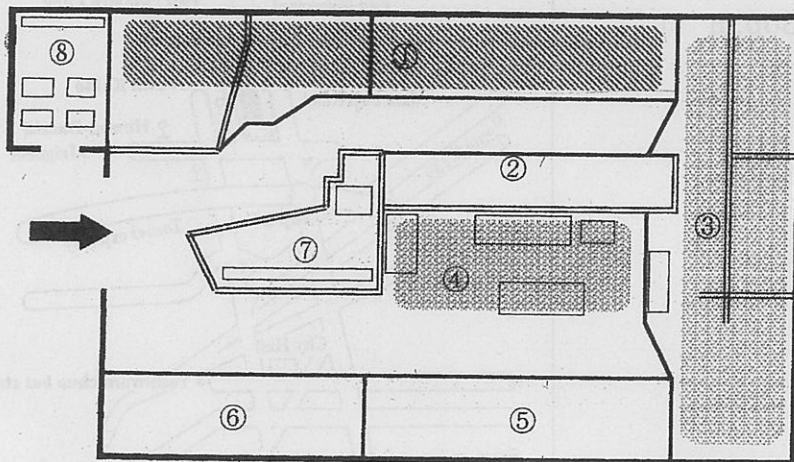
Fuji Municipal Museum

The Principal theme of Fuji Municipal Museum is "Living in Fuji—the history and culture of 'Fuji Paper city'". The central theme is the collection and preservation of research Materials and objects. We hold exhibition halls and learning workshops in order to understand this theme. Because Fuji is considered as 'The Paper City' we have prepared 'The Paper Exhibition Hall'. In this way the expanding course and history of the City of Fuji can be understood. In 1994, the second Hall of the History of Popular Customs was constructed. This Hall is especially reserved for the exhibition of objects from different regions of Fuji.

Exhibition Room No. 1

Exhibition room No.1 is divided into Historical and Cultural periods of the ancestors who lived on the South base of Mount Fuji. Observe the efforts and the energy of the people who built up the foundation of Fuji City's development.

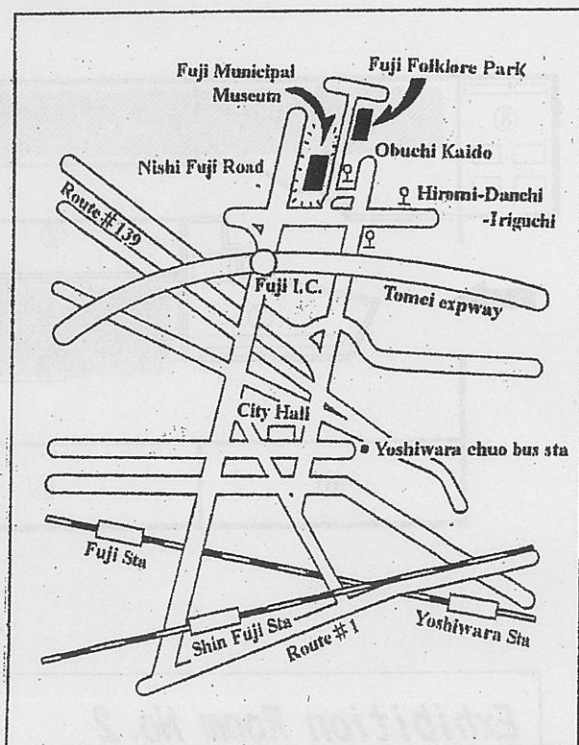
